VACCINE UPDATE

In a little over a year, we have gone from having our first confirmed case of COVID-19 in Mills County, to now having three vaccines to help stop the spread of the virus. Vaccines are available to all individuals age 16+ (Pfizer) or 18+ (Moderna and Janssen). Mills County Public Health is currently scheduling a Saturday clinic on April 17, 2021. If you have questions or concerns about getting the vaccine, the Iowa Department of Public Health is partnering with Iowa State University and the University of Iowa to answer Iowan's questions and make sure they have the facts they feel they need to feel comfortable getting a COVID-19 vaccine.
